<p><u>2014</u> September 23</p>	 <p>Sutton-Turner</p>	<p><i>“Pioneer Families” by Anne Billeter</i> - An Oregon Trail diary, an elopement, a newspaper family, a sheriff, and “the best musician in southern Oregon.” Learn about the families woven into the fabric of the Sutton-Turner Double Wedding Ring quilt.</p>
<p>October 28</p>	 <p>Table Rock</p>	<p><i>“Table Rock Wildflowers: A Legacy of Beauty and Diversity” by Molly Morison and Marcia Wineteer</i> - Over 200 species of wildflowers grow at the Table Rocks making these iconic landmarks one of the best spots for viewing spring blossoms in the valley. Molly and Marcia will stitch together wildflower stories and relate how the amazing botanical fabric inspires.</p>
<p>November 25</p>	 <p>Living with The Land</p>	<p><i>“Growing Up, Takelma” by Pat Harper</i> - The Takelma people were hunter-gatherers who lived along the banks of the Rogue River and its tributaries for many generations before Europeans came to Jackson County. Can research tell us about the life of a Takelma child, and the child’s expectations for life as an adult? Do we know enough to speculate about food, clothing, games and ceremonies?</p>
<p><u>2015</u> January 27</p>	 <p>Postal Friendship</p>	<p><i>“Post Offices in Jackson County” by Nancy Swan</i> - A gift from the Southern Oregon Philatelic Society, the quilt shares local postal history. Learn about Jackson County Post Offices, the ones you have never heard of and those named for local families or leaders - their postmark on the land! A reminder of the significance of postal history to your family research.</p>
